□ Have not participated in Youth Parliament previously. Previous Youth Parliamentarians are not eligible to apply.		
□ Available to attend Youth Parliament on April 29 - May 1, 2025. Travel dates are April 27 and May 2, 2025, for students travelling to Yellowknife. Expenses covered by the Legislative Assembly include: Airfare, accommodation, meals, and any scheduled extracurricular activities. Additional money for shopping during free time will not be provided.		
□ All applications must be completed in full. Incomplete applications will be rejected & returned to the student.

ASSIGNMENT INSTRUCTIONS:

A Member's Statement is an important part of the daily agenda during a Legislative Assembly session. It allows a Member to make a two-and-a-half-minute address on any topic of importance to their community. These statements are an opportunity to celebrate achievements, raise concerns, or bring attention to issues that impact the Constituency. Member Statements often focus on problems that require attention, particularly those that can be addressed through changes in government laws, policies, or services.

For your application, you are required to submit a Member's Statement. This can either highlight something positive happening in your Constituency, or it can focus on a concern or issue that you feel needs to be addressed. Member Statements are typically used to raise issues and advocate for change, so be sure to frame your statement with a clear point of view and possible solutions.

Tips for Writing a Member's Statement:

- **Keep it concise:** Your statement should be **400 words or less**. Stay focused on the key message you want to convey.
- **Structure it properly:** Always address the Speaker at the beginning of your statement. For example: "Mr. Speaker, I rise today to bring forward..." This is the formal way of addressing the House.
- **Be respectful and neutral:** In a consensus government like ours, it's important to approach issues with respect for all parties. While it's okay to point out problems or shortcomings in government, avoid making personal attacks or using inflammatory language. Stick to the facts and focus on proposing practical solutions. Remember, your goal is to engage in constructive dialogue.
- Write as you would speak: Craft your statement in a way that reflects your natural speaking style. Keep it clear, direct, and easy to follow, as if you were delivering it to an audience in person.
- Do your research: To help shape your statement, you can look at previous Member Statements from past assemblies. These can be found in the Hansard archives on the Legislative Assembly website: <u>Hansard</u> or on the Open NWT site: <u>Open NWT Hansard</u>.
