

- It will include a capital improvement program with phasing for implementation, identifying critical capital decisions, cost estimation and defining each of the projects and financial plan.

## Yellowknife Airport – Where the North Connects

#### **Vision**

Stronger Airport.
Stronger Impact.
Stronger Economy.

#### **Mission**

To provide and promote safe, secure, reliable, and sustainable air transportation that drives economic development by strengthening connections, capturing opportunities, and embracing innovation.



- The Gateway to the Northwest Territories and Western Arctic located only ten minutes from Yellowknife City Centre
- Serving over **375,000 (ATB)** and **135,000** (**FBO**) passengers annually across eight (8) carriers
- Critical hub for cargo, charter flights, general aviation, medical travel, and national defence operations
- Launching pad for connecting services by road and air to tourist activities across the Northwest Territories
- Recent **forecast** estimates that by 2025 ATB passengers will reach over 425,000 and FBO users will reach over 150,000.
- Supporting over **1000 direct jobs** with a direct economic output of just under \$600 Million.

#### **Top NWT Tourism Activities:**


- Aurora Viewing (43% of leisure travel volume)
- General Touring (24%)
- Outdoor Adventure (9%)
- Fishing & Hunting (6%)
- Visiting Friends and Relatives (18%)

### Protecting Canada's Sovereignty in the North

- YZF acts as a crucial hub for the Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) in the North and has a North American Aerospace Defense Command (NORAD) Forward Operating Location
  - Accommodates fighter jets, support personnel, and storage facilities
- CAF supported firefighting & evacuation efforts from YZF in 2023
- DND owns and operates the Evans Building (home to JTFN HQ) in the
   City of Yellowknife and float docks by Great Slave Lake
- The 440 Squadron operates out of a DND-owned hangar on leased land at YZF. Part of the facility is leased to the RCMP.

#### **Upgrades to NORAD Forward Operating Location**

- In June 2022, Canada launched a \$38.6 billion plan to modernize NORAD which includes upgrades to Northern Basing Infrastructure
- There is an upcoming upgrade/expansion of CAF facilities at the Yellowknife Forward Operating Location (southwest of aerodrome)
- Flexible Design: Multi-purpose opportunities will be considered with Indigenous and Northern governments and partners.



## Looking Ahead – Future Improvements

- Check-in Area → layout reconfiguration to support increased demand, optimize on queuing space and also improve passenger flow that currently obstructs the terminal activity and impeded on entrance doors to facility.
- Pre-Board Screening > required enhancements to accommodate queue length, increase throughput, passenger screening processing, and customer service enhancements (training).
- Terminal Washroom → accessibility improvements and layout design improvements are required
- Airside Mobile Bridge Adapters → improvements to the apron boarding and deplanement of passengers to address safety and accessibility concerns.
- Baggage Claim Areas → modifications with the existing layout to accommodate passenger waiting areas
  and create larger separation between the arrival process and facilitating non-screened activity.

## Next Steps

- Yellowknife Airport plays an important role to the Territory and it's only getting busier.
- We connect the Territory by land and air.
- Our partners, the services we provide and how the Airport operates are key to a reliable, consistent and safe operation.
- Yellowknife Airport enables growth: tourism, economic, air services, DND, goods and services.
- YZF is not slowing down anytime soon with strong forecasts
- Enhancements for improvements aligned with the community, the partners and passengers needs.
- Next Steps: Continued cooperation and collaboration as we move through the next steps of this strategy.

## Next Steps

- InterVISTAS is working on completion of Case Studies, 2 of 4 interviews are competed and work is being done on securing dates and times for 2 additional studies.
- InterVISTAS is working with YZF on a short and mid strategy for Capital Plan Improvements
- Updates to be presented to the Economic Advisory Committee (EAC) at June's EAC Meeting.
- Targeting early summer for completion of the Strategic Plan along with the Case Studies and Capital Improvement Plan.
- Develop a strategy with InterVISTAS and EAC to present to various stakeholders and governments in the fall of 2024
