### Senior Home Heating Subsidy Overview

- The Senior Home Heating Subsidy program is intended to assist low-to-modest income seniors in the NWT with their heating costs.
- In order to qualify for the Senior Home Heating Subsidy, Seniors must:
  - Apply each year
  - Be residing in the NWT
  - Own and occupy their home as their primary residency or if renting, be the lessee of a selfcontained unit where heating costs are not included
  - Are 60 years of age or older
  - Meet the household income threshold (based on Community)
- The Senior Home Heating Subsidy provides a monthly subsidy from September through April and is typically paid directly to the Senior(s)' supplier of choice.



### Senior Home Heating Subsidy Overview

- Seniors must submit an Application for Income Assistance for Seniors and Persons with Disabilities and Senior Home Heating Subsidy, on an annual basis
- Provide the following:
  - Proof of Age
  - Proof of Homeownership or Confirmation of Rental Accommodation
  - Proof of Income:
    - Notice of Assessment for the previous calendar year
    - Other Income Verification, if requesting a current year reassessment
- The Client Navigator will review the application and supporting documentation, confirm the Senior(s)' income is less than the allowable income threshold.
- Seniors will then be required to arrange for fuel delivery and payment directly with their supplier.

#### Senior Home Heating Subsidy Overview


 For the purposes of determining Income Threshold, the following calculation is used to determine net income:

Line 23600 of the Notice of Assessment

Less: Amount for the SHHS in the applicant's zone

Less: Amount received for Canada Pension Plan Disability benefits

Total: Net income for SHHS purposes


## **Income Thresholds and Subsidy Amounts**

	Zone 1	Zone 2	Zone 3
Income Threshold	Up to \$56,000	Up to \$64,000	Up to \$73,000
Monthly Subsidy Amount	\$375	\$500	\$575
Additional Enhancement (per month)	\$85	\$60	\$175
Total Enhanced Monthly Subsidy	\$460 (\$3,680 per year)	\$560 (\$4,480per year)	\$750 (\$6,000 per year)







### Historical Changes to SHHS

#### <u>2018</u>

- SHHS moved from a fuel allocation system to a monetary system, where instead of receiving a set allotment of fuel they received a set annual dollar value
- Removed the phase-out income thresholds
- Expanded to the subsidy to renters

#### 2020

- Modified how communities were allocated to zones
- Provided a modest increase to the benefit amounts

#### <u>2023</u>

SHHS moved from an annual allotment to a monthly subsidy during an 8-month period

#### 2024

- Launched the new Income Assistance for Seniors and Persons with Disabilities program
- Seniors complete one application
