Suicide Prevention

Moved by the Member for Kam Lake:

NOW THEREFORE, I MOVE, seconded by the Honourable Member for Nunakput, that this Legislative Assembly calls upon the Government of the Northwest Territories to establish a suicide prevention fund of \$250,000 in each region and is expedited directly to communities in crisis without application;

AND FURTHER, that the Government of the Northwest Territories create a coordinated, collaborative, multi-departmental suicide prevention team to meet with communities in crises to assist community leadership identify suicide prevention strategies and activities as well as Government of the Northwest Territories funding that communities can access;

AND FURTHERMORE, that the Government of the Northwest Territories subsidize all recreation fees in small communities and create new recreational activities for youth and young adults;

AND FURTHERMORE, the Government of the Northwest Territories provide a response to this motion within 120 days.
