- Indigenous guided, community led and RCMP-supported effort.
- Generate and encourage positive momentum.
- Focus on rebuilding and repairing relationships.
- Create a safe space to heal in a meaningful and respectful way.
- Opportunity to do better and create new relationships built on respect, equity, unity, and healing.
- Committed to change.

## Working Together

- Seek permission from the Indigenous Righholders.
- Receive guidance from Indigenous Elders, Chiefs and community members and organizations.
- Work together to highlight Indigenous culture.
- Participate in national and local planning steering committees.
- Part of the process every step of the way.

### **One Spirit Unity Run**

- In partnership with Indigenous community members and organizations
- National walk/run event taking place October 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2023.
- 12 races will take place in 12 locations across Canada.

All proceeds stemming from the One Spirit Unity Run will be donated to Indigenous-operated healing initiatives in Indigenous communities across the country.
