




# Bluenose-East & Bathurst Caribou: Survey Results, Management Actions & Next Steps







## **Bluenose-East Survey Block Flight Lines June 2021**

### **Bluenose-East Estimates for 2021**





# **Bathurst Survey Results**






# **Bathurst Photo & Visual Blocks Flight Lines June 2021**




Coverage:

#### **Caribou East of Bathurst Inlet:**

- Too Many to Be All Bathurst
  - Beverly cows as well
- Mix of Cows, Bulls, Yearlings
- Some Bathurst Cows Calved East of Inlet
- No Herd Separation at Survey Time


#### Post-calving (later in June):

- **East of Inlet:** collared cows went east
- West of Inlet: collared Cows went south and west

## **Bathurst Herd Estimates 2009-2021**








## **Mobile Core Bathurst Caribou Management Zone**
