Oral Question 280-20(1): Apply for a Name Change

This letter is in follow-up to the Oral Question you raised on June 11, 2024, regarding Applying for a Name Change. Specifically, you requested a list of health and social services legislation that identifies the forms prescribed by legislation to include sex or gender in a binary fashion.

The Department completed a scan of health legislation and found there is no specific legislative requirements to include sex or gender in a binary fashion in the respective corresponding forms. However, the *Change of Name Regulations* (*Change of Name* Act) includes the *Application for Change of Name Form* within the regulations and is the only legislated form that requires identifying a person's gender in a specific fashion, as M, F or X.

As committed, the Department has updated the Change of Name (CON) web pages and the instructions to the <u>Document Checklist – Application for Change of Name</u> to clarify the process for requesting an exemption to having a CON publicly posted in the Gazette in order to address the concern that having a deadname (birth name) publicly posted can be a harmful experience for transgender, non-binary, and gender-diverse persons.
