Resolution to Legislature

Whereas the Town of Norman Wells has been requesting long-term solutions from the Government of the Northwest Territories and has offered to work with the Government of the Northwest Territories on proactive community planning because of climate change impacts on resupply to Norman Wells which has resulted in:

- Rising food insecurity: cost and availability of food
- Rising heat fuel costs: heat or eat situation
- A resultant prohibitive cost of living
- A resultant prohibitive cost of doing business, **and:**

Whereas Imperial Oil Resources is transitioning out of the community and:

- With it a vital tax base for service provision locally and territorially disappears
- Vital access to skilled workers across all sectors disappears
- Power transmission in Norman Wells is at risk, **and:**

Whereas the Government of the Northwest Territories has not responded in a meaningful, long-term way to the concerns expressed by the Town of Norman Wells, **and:**

Whereas the solutions proposed by the Town of Norman Wells have in no way been addressed by the Government of the Northwest Territories. Those solutions are as listed below:

- That the Government of the Northwest Territories recognize the Town's local declaration of emergency and be referred to the Government of Canada for humanitarian aid
- That the Government of the Northwest Territories develop a comprehensive policy and procedure with which to deal with a Humanitarian State of Emergency in its communities for which it is responsible
- That the Government of the Northwest Territories engage in sustainable community planning with stakeholders in Norman Wells
- That the Government of the Northwest Territories facilitate a discussion between Imperial Resources and the Government of Canada and the TLEGOHLT GOT'INE, **and:**

Whereas the Town of Norman Wells has sought and received legal and federal legislative advice from the Senate of Canada on declaring a Local State of Emergency for Humanitarian Reasons, **and:**

Now therefore be it resolved that the Government of the Northwest Territories;

- **Declare a State of Emergency for Humanitarian Reasons for Norman Wells which will then be taken to the Government of Canada for aid.**
- **Engage with the Town of Norman Wells Mayor, Council and business community in the development of sustainable, proactive planning going forward.**

Town of Norman Wells Declaration of a Local State of Emergency

Declaration of a Local State of Emergency

Background:

The Town of Norman Wells Mayor and Council have been actively advocating to the Government of the Northwest Territories for vital aid to our community because of the following:

- Climate change impacts to the Mackenzie River resulting in barge cancellation for 1.5 seasons. We anticipate that next season will have to be cancelled as well.
- Climate change impacts on life of the winter road and resulting unpredictability of vital resupply by winter road
- The prohibitive cost of flying in all fuel types to our community, especially heating fuel which resulted in approximately \$5.50 per litre to the consumer.
- The unaffordable cost of living in Norman Wells because all increased costs incurred are downloaded to our residents, food and household needs particularly expensive
- The unpredictable future of IORL in Norman Wells
- Lack of qualified staff across the board in Norman Wells

There has been either no response or at best a piece meal response from the Government of the Northwest Territories and no proactive approach to ongoing and likely to occur issues going forward.

Whereas the Town of Norman Wells has abided by all processes, procedures and actions necessary to provide a sustainable community, and:

Whereas *“A sustainable community uses its resources to meet current needs while ensuring that adequate resources are available for future generations. It involves all its citizens in an integrated, long-term planning process to protect the environment, expand economic opportunities, and meet social needs.”*—CONCERN, Inc. and in fact the Town of Norman Wells has acted as the evacuation center for Fort Good Hope evacuees during the fires of 2024, and the concern is that we may not be able to step up should the same reoccur, and:

Whereas the Town of Norman Wells has offered solutions and advice to the Government of the Northwest Territories and where the Town and its business community offered to work with the Territorial Government together on said solutions and to date no substantive response from the Territorial Government and:

Whereas the sustainability of Norman Wells over time is of major concern because of:

- rising food insecurity
- concerns about our ongoing tax base
- lack of skilled workers
- prohibitive cost of living, food, heat, travel etc.
- prohibitive cost of doing business

With this Petition, signed by 2,500 concerned local and national citizens we demand that the Government of the Northwest Territories:

Enact a Declaration of a Humanitarian State of Emergency at the Territorial level for the Town of Norman Wells.

And

GNWT takes the territorial State of Humanitarian Emergency to the Government of Canada and demands Federal assistance outside of understood Disaster Funds. This aid could be in kind and financial, as has been done for other municipalities in Canada,

And

The above actions would allow for immediate emergency relief and a window within which we could discuss a 5-year plan for the inevitability of this occurring again.

Such as:

- systemic change with regards to social assistance

- increase funding for school food programs and community food banks
- proactive resupply planning and cost reduction
- winter road logistics
- proactive and cooperative community planning with the community through transition

Resolution:

Now therefore, be it resolved that the Council of the Town of Norman Wells hereby declares a local state of emergency for the Town of Norman Wells, effective immediately, to respond to the ongoing humanitarian crisis in Norman Wells.

This will be forwarded to the Government of the Northwest Territories in our attempt to ensure our sustainability as a community through this ongoing crisis.

Town of Norman Wells Interim Strategic Plan

Interim Strategic Plan for the Town of Norman Wells – 2025

A message to the Community of Norman Wells from Mayor and Council of the Town of Norman Wells

Mayor and Council, 2019 formulated a strategic plan for the Town of Norman Wells in 2019 which has been assessed for progress and accepted by each Council thereafter until Mayor and Council 2025 determined the necessity to create an interim Strategic Plan for the Town of Norman Wells given the crossroads, we presently find our community in.

The crossroads we find ourselves at has been created by:

- Unprecedented climate change impacts on the Mackenzie River, prohibiting barge supply delivery to our community
- Climate change impacts on the winter road which has markedly shortened the winter road season
- Prohibitive cost of living and cost of doing business in our community directly because of higher resupply costs (these have been increasing since COVID 19)
- Decreasing population
- Decreasing business presence
- Skilled staff shortages across the community
- Immediate and long-term unpredictability of Imperial Resources presence in Norman Wells

Mayor and Council believe we need to address the above issues for the survival of our community.

Priority areas as defined by Mayor and Council are:

- Community, regional and Government of the Northwest Territories and Federal government education as to the realities of our situation and solutions going forward
- Achievement of the following:
 - 5-year transition plan for Norman Wells to address Imperial Oil Resources inevitable operational shutdown
 - Long-term guarantees on winter road maintenance plans and logistics plan
 - Long-term guarantees on affordable living models for residents and businesses

Much of what we pledged in 2019-2024 has been accomplished. Our sustainability as a community into the future is severely compromised at this point in our history. Mayor and Council will continue to advocate to the Territorial and Federal levels of Government. Our efforts are stronger with your support.

Together we will accomplish our goals!

Mayor and Council for the Town of Norman Wells

Vision:

We believe that:

Governance refers to the processes, systems, and practices through which an organization, community, or country is managed and directed. It involves the decision-Governance encompasses the structures and systems that ensure accountability, transparency, responsiveness, rule of law, stability, equity, and inclusiveness. Good governments are essential for the orderly functioning of society, the provision of public goods and services, the protection of rights, and the management of collective resources and decisions.

We believe that good governance creates proactive policy and plans for their constituents. Thereby providing necessary stability and sustainability for community businesses and residents.

Mission:

To hold the levels of government upon which we are dependent to their responsibility to govern. Thereby ensuring that we do not have a 2-tier service delivery system for essential services in Norman Wells.

We demand that the Government of the Northwest Territories and the Federal Government be accountable to our community in their responsibility to us.

We require a proactive not a piecemeal crisis response to our current situation.

We require guarantees over time for the supports we have identified to ensure an equitable level of service for all our community members:

- Healthcare Services
- Home Heat
- Affordable Food
- Sound Educational system

Leadership:

We have consistently exhibited community leadership by example to our community, the Sahtu Region, the Territorial Government and the Nation.

We demand that the Government of the Northwest Territories treat our community and all Northwest Territories communities with the respect, integrity and fairness we deserve.

We demand a vehicle through which we can voice our proposed solutions and work with the Territorial Government on our future.

Growth:

We will manage our growth as per our responsibility delegated to us by the Territorial Government.

We demand that the Government of the Northwest Territories recognize and plan for identified and inevitable impacts to our growth.

- The loss of Imperial Oil Resources
- Extreme climate change impacts on the winter road and the Mackenzie River, which are our vital links to affordable resupply, without which we are a 100% fly-in community

We demand that the Government of the Northwest Territories actively commit to the development of a transition growth plan for Norman Wells in tandem with Council and the business community.

Strategic Priorities

The status of our strategic priorities has been stalled by the resupply, cost of living crisis and unpredictable future we are presently experiencing. We are concerned about the sustainability of the Town's service delivery.

Human Resources:

All government and businesses in our community are experiencing:

- Skilled worker shortages
- Manual labourer shortages
- Trouble retaining and attracting staff at all levels

This is impacting available service availability and service levels across all sectors.

Our population is changing in that more staff are choosing to be rotational.

Our population numbers are declining.

All the above impacts funding for the Town.

Economic Diversification:

We are working with the business community to find solutions:

- Advocacy
- Transitional fuel modelling
- Transitional development plan

Community Safety and Wellbeing:

- The provision of safe, potable water requires skilled staff, maintained infrastructure and users. Our present situation puts this at risk.
- Decreased education and social supports put our community at risk.
- Prohibitive cost of living places undue economic stress on all families and businesses = more foreclosures, depression and related addiction issues
- Cost of food resulting in more pressure on Food Bank and school programs with less funding available

Committed actions going forward:

- A. Council will extend Declaration of State of Emergency for presentation to the Government of the Northwest Territories Legislative Assembly, at their February 5th session along with petition.
- B. Community education and engagement.
We will continue to inform our community and Canada about our concerns and progress through all avenues available to us.
We will engage our community in our advocacy efforts.
We will hold a Town Hall to inform the community of our efforts, challenges and this Interim Strategic Plan.
- C. Government of the Northwest Territories education and engagement.
We will present our petition to the legislature of the Government of the Northwest Territories at the February 5th, 2025, meeting of the legislature.
We will continue to utilize local and national media to inform the Territorial Government of our plight.
We will educate the decision makers on how power is supplied to Norman Wells.
We will educate the decision makers on the need for a transition plan for Norman Wells considering Imperial Resources inevitable operational shutdown.
We will clearly outline what we see as the responsibility of the Territorial Government in relation to each of our challenges and demand active, committed responses from them.
- D. We will continue our advocacy efforts regionally, territorially and federally. We will facilitate, support and manage an active advocacy committee with community business.
- E. We will facilitate and manage a Steering Committee with representatives from relevant IORL units, NTPC, the Government of the Northwest Territories and Canadian Fuel Operations.
- F. We will continue to identify and nurture working relationships with relevant stakeholders.

Emergency Response Impacts in Norman Wells resulting from a shut-in or closure of Imperial Oil facilities in Norman Wells

Emergency Response Impacts in Norman Wells resulting from a shut-in or closure of Imperial Oil facilities

The REMC for the Sahtu Region met with the Mayor and SAO of Norman Wells on Wednesday, January 22nd to discuss the Emergency Response impacts of a shut-in or closure of IOL's facilities in Norman Wells. While the Imperial Oil Resources application for the Water License renewal is awaiting a decision from the Sahtu Land and Water Board (SLWB) in addition to its application for the replacement of Line 490, currently before the Mackenzie Valley Review Board, the Town of Norman Wells have had numerous meetings with IOL representatives over the past number of months to obtain a clear understanding of the impact of an IOL shut-in or closure to the town.

The discussions were held in an attempt to identify and quantify the impacts related to the towns ability respond and manage an Emergency Response that may occur within the town as well as the ability to render assistance to other communities within the Sahtu Region.

Fire Department

The Norman Wells Fire Department currently has 12 active members and operates one Rescue Unit and one Pumper Unit. The Town anticipates that it will lose 50% of the active members over the next 12-24 months as a direct result an IOL closure and the pending move of North-Wright Airways main hanger and office headquarters to Yellowknife.

As with many of the daily operations in the town, they are reliant on having a stable and reliable population base from which to draw from for the Fire Department, as many of the volunteer firefighters are employed by local companies and contractors who are living in the community whose main employment is directly tied to IOL. IOL staff, who are for the most part rotational workers, are not involved in the Volunteer Fire Department. A reduced staffing level will impact response times, level of service, safety and capabilities of the Department.

Utilities – Water and Sewer

The Town of Norman Wells and its citizens are dependent on trades personnel and companies who have operations in Norman Wells to service IOL. These trades personnel and companies are vital to the continued maintenance of the water within the town to provide a safe and reliable supply of drinking water. The 2024 waterline replacement project was put on hold due to the lack of bids and qualified contractors other than Graham Construction, an IOL contractor, who due to the pending shut-in, do not have sufficient work in Norman Wells to assist in the water line replacement.

The Town currently have three (3) certified Water & Sewer operators, however with the deficit in the labor pool across Canada, the ability for the town to hire and retain a qualified operator, should one or more current operators leave, is severely impacted. Once again this will impact the safe and reliable supply of water to the Town.

Public Works Department

The Town currently relies on private companies to service and maintain heavy equipment and the Fire Department vehicles. The maintenance and repair of this equipment relies heavily on qualified heavy-duty mechanics to perform this work. Once again, the availability of a qualified mechanic will be drastically reduced which will impact the Towns ability to respond to an emergency if equipment is compromised.

Power Supply

NTPC purchases electricity from IOL and resells it to the community. NTPC in Norman Wells has a standby plant with two (2) diesel generators with a maximum capacity of 2.8 MW. NTPC has plans to deliver one additional generator to Norman Wells this winter road season, however that additional generator will require a re-build after delivery to Norman Wells. The Town has arranged for a shop where the re-build can be completed prior to installation.

As with all infrastructure, the possibility of equipment failure is a very real possibility as was witnessed this month in Fort Smith when equipment failure caused multiple power outages. Residents of Fort Smith have been relying on generators for electricity since 2023. According to an NTPC spokesperson, the generators could meet the towns electricity demands however using them for an extended period has caused mechanical and electrical issues which resulted in several of them needing repair.

The use of generators to supply power for the Town of Norman Wells may result in similar issues as those experienced in Fort Smith, with the added requirement of a safe and reliable supply of diesel fuel. With the possibility of a reduced or non-existent 2025 barge season this will require that an adequate stockpile of fuel be available for 2025 and years following. Loss of power during the cold winter months will place additional emergency response burdens on the community to get through an extended power outage.

Hosting Community

The ability for the Town of Norman Wells to be used as a hosting community for evacuees of neighboring communities may be severely curtailed. The 2024 wildfire season saw Norman Wells open their doors to residents of Fort Good Hope providing meals, accommodation and cultural activities. Numerous evacuees were housed and fed at the school gym and Community Hall. In the past month the Town of Norman Wells has had to close the Community Hall due to structural issues. A Tender has been issued for the pair of those issues and will close on January 30th, 2025

however there is no firm date on when those repairs will be completed. The Community Hall can accommodate forty (40) cots and has kitchen facilities which were utilized during the 2024 evacuation to prepare and serve over 600 meals daily. The uncertainty of a timeline on completion of the repairs effectively limits the community's ability to serve as a hosting community in 2025. Again, this is a symptom of the pending shut-in/closure of IOL as many contractors and companies will be unprepared to take on the work and supply construction materials as required, they will have to be brought in during the 2025 winter road season.

About requests for federal assistance

In Canada, emergencies are managed first at the local level: hospitals, fire departments, police and municipalities. If they need assistance at the local level, they request it from their province or territory. If the emergency escalates beyond their capacity, the province or territory seeks assistance from the federal government.

A request for federal assistance (RFA) is how a province or territory formally requests support from the federal government in their emergency response efforts. The RFA involves official communication and coordination between provincial, territorial or federal departments and Public Safety. It outlines the additional resources the jurisdiction needs for an effective response.

The province or territory submits a formal RFA to describe what they would need in federal government support for a successful emergency response. The well-established process in place for managing RFAs, through the Government Operations Centre (GOC), includes interdepartmental consultation and coordination.

RFAs can include support for:

- Operational Coordination;
- Emergency Evacuation, Transportation and logistics;
- Specialized Response Resources for Wildland Interface fires, flooding, hurricane and extreme weather; and
- Emergency Public Health, Medical and Social Services.

The GOC continues to coordinate formal requests for assistance from federal departments and provincial and territorial governments.

RFAs can range from straightforward to complex requiring significant and sustained responses. Public Safety's [regional offices](#) and the GOC collaborate with the province or territory and other federal government partners to assess and address requests, whether through federal departments

or non-government organizations.

Public Safety's Government Operations Centre is ready to respond to any situation, at any time. Its all-hazards approach to planning, response and support means the Government of Canada can adapt quickly, under any circumstance, when a province or territory asks for help.

Kingston, Ont. declares food insecurity an emergency

CEO of the Ottawa Food Bank Rachael Wilson says they have seen a 90 per cent increase in food bank users since 2019.

City council in Kingston, Ont. has declared food insecurity an emergency in the eastern Ontario city, as food banks see record-breaking demand for assistance.

Councillors unanimously approved a motion from Coun. Brandon Tozzo to declare a food insecurity emergency in Kingston, with the motion calling on the Ontario and federal governments to do more to provide assistance to people in the city and across Ontario.

The motion from Tozzo notes Kingston, Frontenac, Lennox and Addington Public Health estimates that one in three households in Kingston are food insecure.

“Food insecurity is defined as the inadequate or insecure access to food due to financial constraints, a marker of pervasive material deprivation (poverty), and posing a serious public health problem because of its association with higher rates of numerous diseases and chronic health conditions and a higher risk of early death,” Tozzo’s motion says.

The councillor says the cost-of-living crisis, precarious work and “acute shocks like COVID-19, illness or eviction, make it more difficult to afford life’s basic needs and live free from poverty.”

“Current social assistance rates are woefully inadequate, making it impossible to afford a healthy diet.”

The motion calls on Kingston council to ask the Ontario government to “immediately raise” social assistance rates and increase base funding to existing school food programs. The motion, seconded by Kingston deputy mayor Gregory Ridge, also urges he federal and

Ontario governments to establish a Guaranteed Liveable Basic Income to “address the causes of food insecurity.”

Tozzo tells CTV News Ottawa many residents are facing food insecurity.

“It’s not knowing where your next meal is coming from or having to choose between paying rent, paying your hydro bill and food,” Tozzo said.

“This is very strong language. And the reason why we’re doing this is we’re trying to advocate to upper levels of government, both the province and the federal government, to take dramatic action on addressing food insecurity.”

The rise of food insecurity has put unprecedented pressure on local food banks, like Partners in Mission Food Bank in Kingston.

Executive Director Dan Irwin tells CTV News Ottawa they have given out a record number of food hampers for four years in a row.

In 2024, they gave out 20,355 hampers to 9,131 people in the Kingston area, which is 10.2 per cent more than in 2023. Hampers provide seven days worth of food.

Irwin says over 2,800 children were included in the total, up nearly 1,000 from the previous year.

“The increase is really putting a lot of pressure on us. We’ve had to get more volunteers,” Irwin explains.

“We’re really hoping declaring a food insecurity emergency will improve awareness that there’s issues,” he adds.

In November, Mississauga city council declared food insecurity an emergency. The motion called on Ontario to improve social assistance programs and invest in “affordable, supportive and public housing.”

The Ottawa Food Bank is calling on the City of Ottawa to declare food insecurity a crisis as it sees a spike in demand for services. The food bank announced last week it is cutting donations to its 98 food programs by up to 50 per cent this year due to rising food costs and the increased demand.

Partners in Mission hasn’t had to cut back on donations like the Ottawa Food Bank.

“We feel very fortunate to be in Kingston. Kingstonians have been very generous,” Irwin says. “And because of their generosity of food, monetary donations and volunteers, we’ve been able to keep up with this rising demand.”

The meeting for Kingston city council begins at 7 p.m. Tuesday.

Norman Wells signed petition



Petition to the Legislative Assembly of the Northwest Territories

We, the undersigned, residents of the Northwest Territories and citizens throughout Canada, draw the attention of the Legislative Assembly to the following:

THAT,

- For multiple years, declining water levels in the Mackenzie River have left communities such as Norman Wells and Tulita unable to resupply via barge;
- MTS cancelled barge delivery of fuel in May 2024, with fuel instead being [delivered during the 2025 winter road season](#);
- In the interim, fuel must be flown into these affected communities, bringing costs to between \$4.65/L for gas to \$5.19/L for stove oil (as of October 9, 2024);
- The result is a domino effect with price increases in all aspects of everyday life – fuel for hunters' snowmobiles, home heating fuel, food prices, etc.;
- The GNWT has its own internal costs associated with the significant increases of home heating fuel for NWT housing units within Norman Wells.
- The GNWT recognizes the impact of the significant increase of home heating fuel on current government employees and its inability to fill vacant job postings;
- The unaffordability crisis is leading many to consider moving out of these communities; and
- Other affected Sahtu communities have had their fuel delivered by winter road and/or at a cost paid by the GNWT.

THEREFORE, your petitioners ask that the Legislative Assembly

- Declare a state of emergency in recognition of the humanitarian crisis faced by Norman Wells residents as consistent with the definition of "emergency" under the *Emergency Management Act*,
"a current or imminent event that requires prompt coordination of action or special regulation of persons or property in order to protect the safety, health or welfare of people";
- Provide rebates for significantly increased diesel shipping costs incurred by Norman Wells residents that have created harm and hardship during the month of October totaling \$1.84M and estimated to reach \$5.2M by time of winter road opening; and
- Coordinate with the Government of Canada to provide immediate relief from the remaining shipping costs from the date that this petition was submitted to the opening of the winter road to heavy traffic either by directly covering costs or via in-kind support.

Summary:

- For several years, our beloved Mackenzie River has seen troubling declines in water levels, leaving communities like Norman Wells unable to resupply via barge. This situation has become dire.
- In May 2024, MTS made the difficult decision to cancel barge deliveries of fuel, meaning that our only option for resupply would be during the 2025 winter road season.

- Declare a state of emergency, recognizing the humanitarian crisis faced by the residents of Norman Wells. This aligns with the definition of “emergency” under the Emergency Management Act, which describes a situation that necessitates prompt coordination of action to safeguard the health and welfare of our people.
- Provide much-needed rebates to offset the exorbitant diesel shipping costs that have caused significant hardship for Norman Wells residents, amounting to \$1.84 million in the month of October alone.
- Collaborate with the Government of Canada to deliver immediate relief from these overwhelming shipping costs from the date of this petition until the winter road opens to heavy traffic. This support could come in the form of direct funding or in-kind assistance.

We appeal to your sense of compassion and urgency. Our communities depend on your leadership during this critical time.
